Aveng Kutlwanong matric learners excel

Aveng hosted a prize-giving ceremony at the Jane Furse Comprehensive School in Jane Furse, Limpopo on Thursday, 2 February 2017. Key highlights from the 2016 matric results include a pass rate of 100%, with 51 distinctions in physical science, 41 distinctions in mathematics, and 39 learners who were awarded distinctions in both maths and physical science.
